Explore the area where the Egyptian mummies are exhibited. Make some observations and answer these questions:

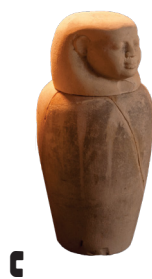
1 What internal organ is missing from Padi-Heru's mummy that is found in most mummies?

ANSWER KEY

Explore the area where the Egyptian mummies are exhibited. Make some observations and answer these questions:

1 What internal organ is missing from Padi-Heru's mummy that is found in most mummies?

The heart

2 What is unusual about Djed-Hor's mummy?

There is an opening in the skull made by a surgical procedure. (Also, the face is unwrapped, and teeth are visible, which tends to be unusual.)

3 Look at where Djed-Hor and Padi-Heru worked. Do you think these two men would have known each other? Why or why not?

No. Though they both served as priests in the same temple, they would not have known each other. Djed-Hor likely died and was mummified approximately 350 years before Padi-Heru.

4 There are five mummies located in this exhibit, but one of them is neither human nor animal. This type of mummy represents the power of regeneration and would be placed in tombs to assist the deceased to be resurrected. What type of mummy is it?
