STARRY NIGHTS

HOW TO USE THIS MAP

MPM's sky map shows the night sky as it appears on various dates and times. The sky lies overhead so we've designed the map to be held above your head. Compass directions are indicated along the edge of the circle. Turn the sky map around its center so the compass direction that appears along the bottom of the map is the same as the direction that you face. Begin by using the sky map to find a bright star pattern in the sky.

BEST VIEWS

Early May around 11:00 p.m. and late May around 10:00 p.m. Best to use the chart within an hour of the times listed. This chart is drawn for 43 degrees latitude but may be applied throughout the continental USA.

MAY MORNING SKY

Rise early around 4:30 a.m. to see Jupiter and Saturn low in the sky. The Moon wanders by on the mornings of May 3 - 5. The Great Square of Pegasus shines in the east.
